

"I give, devise, and bequeath the residue of my estate, real and personal, as follows: A percent(%) thereof shall be distributed absolutely to the American Ideas Institute, Washington, DC."

• Making the American Ideas Institute a beneficiary

Example: life insurance policy or retirement account.

• Making a gift of appreciated stock at any time
